Applicant transcripts must also be on file and officially evaluated by the Yuba College Admissions & Records office before the application is submitted. No in-progress coursework is accepted. August-September applications: Transcripts must be received by the 3rd Monday in August <i>prior</i> to applying. February applications: Transcripts must be received by 3rd Monday in January <i>prior</i> to applying. Any transcripts received after the deadline will not be accepted.

In addition, an electronic transfer of your TEAS score from ATItesting.com will also be required.

Selection Process: Each incoming class will be selected based on the ranking of total points. The applicants with the highest scores are selected for admission. There is no minimum Merit-Based Score needed to apply; however, you must achieve 70 or higher on your TEAS test.
