Therefore, the course interest form will allow us to keep in touch with you and track our potential enrollment for each academy. Please keep in mind that course dates are subject to change and possible cancelation due to low enrollment. If you have completed an interest form at this point, do not complete an additional one.			
Step 2:	Monday, August 31, 2020: Application packets will be available on-line. Students will need to make sure the below items can be fulfilled when completing the Fire Technology Application. This will be a challenging and time-consuming class, using an accelerated scheduling format. The required 80% academic standard for the Firefighter I Academy is rigorous. Candidates need to be aware at the outset that this will place extraordinary demands on them physically and emotionally. Time management will also be critical. Medical Clearance & Proof of Vaccinations:

It is necessary to obtain a medical clearance from a physician. The medical clearance is required to provide reasonable assurance that there is no medical reason why you should not participate in the program. And, medical clearance must be obtained at your own expense. This clearance needs to be 6-months current.

Step 4:

REQUIRED APPLICATION FORMS:

Health/History Statement & Par-Q (complete prior to seeing your physician). This form is NOT needed back; doctor review ONLY.

Physician Signature Page/Stamp – You may go to your own physician or any Urgent Care facility to obtain clearance. Note: not all insurances will cover a physical. This fee may be expected at the time you are seen by the physician and can vary in cost.

EMT Checklist Items

- Enroll and Complete **EMT 510** at Yuba College
- MMR Two Shot Series or Positive Titer
- **Hep B** Proof of 3 shot series, Positive Titer or sign declination
- **TDAP** (Tetanus/Diphtheria) Proof of vaccination or sign declination
- Varicella (Chicken Pox) Two Shot Series or Positive Titer
- TB Skin Test Dated June 2020-21
- Flu Shot Date approximately October 2020 January 2021 (or sign declination & mask will be worn during clinical hours.)

**Most items should be located on your childhood shot record.

***Any needed shots will be at each student's expense.

EMT Certification:

More information will be given to you by the EMT Instructor. You should be prepared to perform the below tasks, which include fees:

A student must be 18 years old by January 2021 to participate in the Fire Academy, per National Registry/EMT requirements.

Clinical Hospital/Ambulance Hours Within the Academy:

DO NOT perform the below tasks until told to do so or you will have to do it again.

Please be aware that you will need to have a 10-Panel Drug Test ONLY from Fremont-Rideout Occupational Health or you will not be allowed to do your clinical hours in the hospital. These tests must be obtained at your own expense. You will also have to have a criminal background check. Both items will be scheduled by your instructor (TBA) and <u>are not pre-requisites</u>. These requirements are date sensitive-background check and drug screen.

After successful completion of your EMT training you need to be aware of the following: National Registry Application for National Registry Exam (www.nremt.org):

- 1) Successfully complete the EMT course (2 years current);
- 2) Non-expired CPR credential for health care providers;
- 3) Create login, pay fees, pass the exam

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<u>Sierra-Sacramento Valley – E.M.S. Application (www.ssvems.com):</u>

A student cannot work in the Sierra-Sacramento area without this certification and will apply and test for SSV-EMS <u>after</u> successfully completing the NREMT process (or any county agency).

- 1) Student must complete a criminal history background check (both state and federal) as specified in Article 4, Chapter 10 of the EMT Initial Certification Requirements
- 2) Complete application, pay fees, pass the exam

A student can still complete the academy by successfully passing the EMT learning domain but not apply for EMT status with NREMT and SSV-EMS (or other applicable agencies). Yuba College currently does not require background clearance; however, this is notice that in order to work as an EMT, you will be subject to the process and fees of the state and federal guidelines.

Please submit Academy Applications as a <u>complete packet</u>. Candidates will receive a letter of acceptance to continue forward for medical clearance and enrollment process. The medical clearance will be required prior to <u>December 5, 2020</u>. Schedule your appointment accordingly but do not obtain clearance until advised to do so. Please provide any changes to your email or physical address to the Public Safety Department.

Please keep in mind that some funding resources and processes may not be available until acceptance to attend the academy. Knowing the criteria, in advance, will alleviate confusion when you complete your requirements.

Certification

Upon successful completion of the Academy, students will meet the training requirements for the California State Fire Marshal Firefighter I. A student will then be able to apply for the Certification after successful completion of the task book and experience requirements. The California State Fire Marshal's Office has completed the National accredited certification process, approved by the Internal Fire Service Accreditation Congress (IFSAC) and the National Board on Fire Service Professional Qualifications (Pro Board). A student completing the Academy will be eligible to apply for these additional certifications. Students will also receive the following State Fire Training certificates: Confined Space Awareness, Hazardous Materials First Responder/DECON (CSTI), Fire Control 3B, Firefighter Survival, Vehicle Extrication, and California Wildland Suppression and Cal- Fire Basic Wildland Firefighter certificates.

The EMT (Emergency Medical Technician) course consist of 170 hours; which includes 156 hours of didactic (lecture) and practical skills lab, and 24 hours of clinical experiences. The curriculum is in compliance with the US DOT (Department of Transportation), the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technician (NREMT), the California State EMS Authority, and the Sierra Sacramento Valley EMS agency.
