To All Training Managers and POCC attendees,

I hope you all had a great holiday season. We are going full steam ahead preparing for the upcoming POCC course, February 22nd through March 25th. This is the "hybrid" offering of the course where the first four weeks of the course is offered on-line, while the last week will be all lab sessions requiring attendees to come to the college for the training. Please note, that we will allow attendees to physically come to the college and sit in a classroom with the instructors during the first four weeks if you so choose.

I wanted to hit on a couple of points with this email. First, all of those attending on-line must make sure that they have a working camera on their computer. We will ask that everyone leave their cameras "on" during the class sessions. This is a vital aspect for meeting the attendance requirements of the course, and quite frankly it also makes for a better teaching/learning environment.

Secondly, I wanted to clarify that even though some students may not be physically coming to the campus during those first four weeks, they must still complete the Covid-19 consent forms as part of the application process for the course. There is two parts to the Covid-19 issue. During the registration process the student simply chooses to "accept" the Covid-19 protocol. They may also download their vaccine card at that time which will clear them to come to the last week of the course on campus. Secondly, if they don't download a vaccine card, then they will have to get a negative Covid-19 test completed within 72 hours of their arrival on campus.

For all those attendees who will be coming to the campus during the first four weeks, they must either download their vaccine card or they will be required to get a negative Covid-19 test for each week of the course. This means they will have to get tested within 72 hours of each Monday session.

Finally, all students will be required to wear a mask when they are within campus buildings, regardless of your vaccination status. No gators or bandanas will be accepted, students are asked to wear masks like surgical masks or N-95 type masks.
