**What:** Submit 2 typed copies of an original poem (created by the contestant submitting it) that incorporates a math theme or uses language particular to or references to mathematics. All entries will be displayed as submitted in the Yuba College library in April. Thus, please submit poems in a typed, clean, suitable format, preferably without being folded.

**Who:** All Yuba College students (including those on the Clear Lake and Beale campuses) and Woodland Community College students (including those on the Colusa campus).

**When:** Due no later than **Thursday, March 17, 2011**.

**Where:** Submit 2 copies of your poem— with your contact information written on the back and your name typed on the front— in the marked drop box at the circulation desk in the Yuba College library. Students from Woodland, Colusa, Clear Lake, and Beale campuses may send their poems to John Thoo at Yuba College, 2088 N. Beale Rd. Marysville, CA 95901.

**Why:** Math is fun and poetry enlightening.
