	<p>The department had a brief discussion regarding common finals and Matt's question regarding same textbooks. It was mentioned that a common textbook should not be required because of the common final (if we continue offering them district-wide, which is questionable due to WCC's different testing dates). We decided that we should not ask WCC and LCC to use the same text as we do and have them choose their own. We did discuss our experience with XYZ Textbooks and acknowledged that those who used it before did not do that in a long time.</p> <p>Math-1A units change - Karsten received feedback from department members to reword the last question, then send it to Doug for his consideration.</p> <p>Update on IA for Hard Math Café – Karsten gave update that due to the non-renewal of the MESA grant, there is currently no money for an IA.
