

How to Submit EARLY ALERT NOTIFICATIONS



The SAGE Early Alert system allows faculty to easily and quickly create electronic progress reports and referrals. Early Alert is a referral system that allows instructors to share concerns about students with counselors and staff in a confidential environment.

Faculty can catch and act on warning signs early so students can get the help they need to succeed. By identifying concerns about students, they may be connected with key campus professionals who can:

- -Address struggles or situations outside of the classroom
- -Effectively match solutions to address their needs
- -Provide options and resources to support student success

SAGE Early Alert is an add-on to TutorTrac, the program already used to track student use in the tutoring centers and other student services. SAGE allows you to respond electronically to requests for attendance and other reports or to submit a referral for your students at any time. The tutoring centers, counselors, and student services programs check SAGE reports regularly for new referrals and to determine what, if any, follow-up is needed.

Step 2 After clicking on the Early Alert Icon or the following this link Log in:
User Name and Password will be the same as your My Campus/Webadvisor login.

Step 3 On the left hand side, under Faculty Courses

Click a **course** (wait for next screen)


Click on **student ID** (wait for next screen)

Click on **SAGE** (middle button, wait for next screen)

Click on **New** (under student name)

Choose appropriate **Referral Type** in drop down box.

- -Kudos Notification (Student receives Email)
- -2nd Week Attendance (Student Services programs access reports)
- -4th Week Early Alert (Student receives email and Student Services programs access reports)
- -10th Week Early Alert (Student receives email and Student Services programs access reports)
- -Confidential Notification (Student Services designee receives notice)



Click Submit when you are finished with this course, and return to the Faculty Courses page to repeat the process for another course.

NOTE: You will not receive specific confirmation that your referrals have been successfully submitted, but you can check on individual students. Click your course name to load its roster, and then click a student's ID number to see the Student Entry box. The SAGE tab will show *your* referrals submitted for this student.
